



Program Staff Activities (Workshop April 2018)

January 2020: Concept Presentation at Council

March 2020: RFA Publication November 2020: Peer Review

April 2021: Award



















June-August 2019: Op Planning Process January – March 2020: RFA development and Review July 2020: Application Submission January 2021: Council Review

Inspiration to FOA publication: ~ 2 years

FOA publication to award: ~ 12 months

"Inspiration to Publication"




NICHD High Priority Research Projects

- Publish a collection of standing FOAs that are science agnostic
 - Use a variety of grant and cooperative agreement funding mechanisms
 - "Placeholders" always ready for use
- High priority topic arises
- A simple Notice specifying the priority scientific need directs applicants to one or more of the placeholder FOAs
